City targets Westwood

WESTWOOD –

The city's largest neighborhood will be home for the next 90 days of Cincinnati's latest Neighborhood Enhancement Program, a project that brings all city departments together with neighborhood groups and local businesses on an intensive neighborhood anti-blight effort.

City Manager Milton Dohoney, flanked by people wearing Westwood T-shirts donated by LaRosa's, kicked off the program Friday morning in a parking lot near McHenry and Harrison avenues.

Dohoney announced the next high-profile step: demolition Wednesday at 3100 McHenry Avenue, an apartment complex he said had long been a community eyesore.

Also, the Cincinnati Area Board of Realtors plans a class and tour about Westwood for real estate agents as well as a July 12 fair for potential homebuyers.
